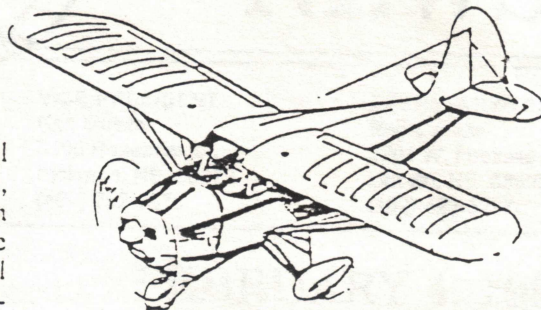
Age Groups:

- Group I Ages 5-8
- Group II Ages 9-12
- Group III Ages 13-16

Format:

Drawings interpreting "My Favorite Air Sport" may be done in water color, marker pens, acrylic paints, soft ball-point pen, or indelible ink pen. (No charcoal or pencil drawings.) Format must be international standard of approximately 11 3/4 x 16 1/2 inches.

Examples of Air Sports are: Powered Aircraft Flying, Ballooning, Soaring, Hang Gliding, Parachuting, Flying in Ultralights, Aerobatic Flying, Air Racing, and Seaplane Flying.



Title:

The title of the art work should be placed on the front of the art work.

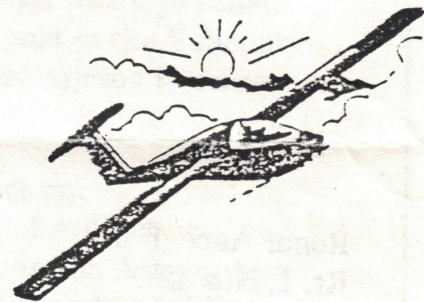

As in past years, each student who participates in the Aviation Art Project earns a Certificate of Participation. However, the top three State winners in each category will be automatically entered into the National project competition. (No submissions will be returned.)

Deadline:

The creative art must be received no later than **MARCH 20, 1992** by the Nebraska Department of Aeronautics, P.O. Box 82088, Lincoln NE 68501 or delivered to the NDA office located in the General Aviation Building on the East ramp of the Lincoln Municipal Airport.

State winners will be recognized with their awards on Saturday, May 16, 1992 at 1:00 p.m. at a ceremony held at Duncan Aviation at the Lincoln Municipal Airport.

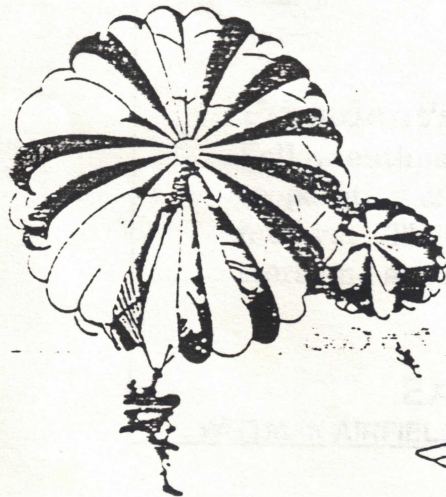
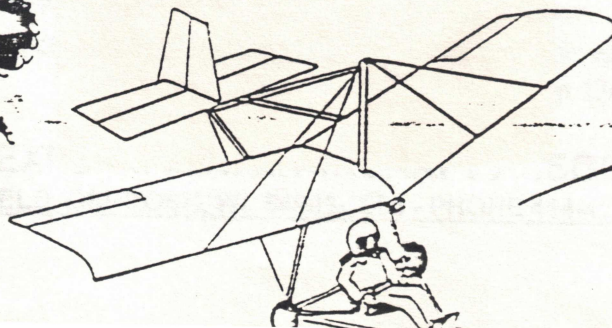
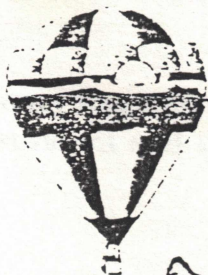
