REPRINTED FROM NOV 1980 FLYING MAGAZINE - HOMEBUILT AIRPORT:

What does a small farming community do when it needs an airport but the nearest public facility is 20 miles away? It chips in, forms a nonprofit corporation and builds a private east-west, 2600 foot grass strip on an 11 acre tract of farm two miles north of town - that's what. Twenty eight of the 6000 residents in Geneseo, Illinois financed the airport. They received much local help with the grading and other construction during the nine-month project, since the whole community stood to benefit. The new airport, named Ford Air Park, has 10 hangars, tie-down space for transients, a small office, a public telephone

and runway lighting. Fuel is available to members only. When the strip was completed, Clyde Johnson, one of the 28, moved his Skyhawk there from the airport at Moline, 20 miles east. "A hometown airport", he says, "is a dream I've had for 33 years."
