Greetings from President Tom Trumble

October 7, 2025 Regular Meeting at Duncan Aviation

The University of Nebraska at Omaha gave a presentation at our October 7 meeting on the Flying Mavs competition team. Team leader Skip Bailey introduced team members Tyler Suing and Mason Good.

The competition includes several academic fields as well as flying events. The student pilots fly the competition events as well as participate in the knowledge events.

Tyler's specialty was the calculations using the old standard non electronic E-6B. He presented several sample problems that given enough time some of us may have solved. During the competition they have an average of 90 seconds to solve each problem.

Mason's specialty was aircraft recognition. They see a picture of an aircraft or part of an aircraft for 3 seconds and then must identify the manufacturer, aircraft name, and model number.

The team has participated in 23 national competitions and placed in the top 10 nationally for the last 16 years.

They are now preparing for the regional competition being held in St. Louis in October of 2025. With a goal of qualifying for the national competition in May of 2026. The Flying May's ultimate goal is to place first, over the University of North Dakota at both the regional and national levels.

NDOT Division of Aeronautics Invites Nebraska Youth to Participate in the 2026 Aviation Art Contest: "Fly to Save Lives"

The Nebraska Department of Transportation's Division of Aeronautics is proud to announce the 2026 FAI International Aviation Art Contest, a global competition that invites youth ages 6–17 to explore the world of aviation through art. This year's inspiring theme is: "Fly to Save Lives."

We encourage Nebraska's youth to showcase their artistic talents by depicting the brave aviators who come to the rescue when disaster strikes. From pilots delivering life-saving supplies and battling wildfires from above to search-and-rescue crews navigating the skies to reach those in need, aviation plays a heroic role in emergency response. Grab your pencils and show us how flight brings hope, help, and heroism to the world!

Artists compete locally, nationally, and internationally. At the state level, which has been sponsored by NDOT's Division of Aeronautics since 1986, winners are selected in three age categories: Junior (6–9), Intermediate (10–13), and Senior (14–17).

Winning entries from Nebraska will advance to the national competition, organized by the National Association of State Aviation Officials (NASAO) and the National Aeronautic Association (NAA) in Washington, D.C. The top three winners in each age group at the national level will move on to compete in the FAI International Aviation Art Contest, which typically draws participants from 20–40 countries worldwide.

Another YE event at Duncan Aviation was held September 26. Approximately 13 St. Patrick's 8th graders took to the skies.

The next scheduled YE event is an open event at the Seward airport on November 8th.

YE's and pilots will be registering through the EAA website for future events.

Cristi Higgins forwarded a thank-you letter from Anders Krzycki to EAA 569 for sponsoring him at the 2025 EAA Air Academy.

The board is considering options for celebrating the 50th anniversary of EAA Chapter 569. June 9, 1976 was the founding date of our chapter. Suggestions are welcome. Inquiries to EAA about hosting the EAA Ford-TriMotor for an event have not brought an encouraging response.

The Midwest Aerobatic Club is considering hosting an introduction to aerobatics at the Seward airport. No date was suggested.

The September 20 EAA 569 breakfast grossed over \$700 despite less-than-ideal flying weather, thanks to a good showing by the Nebraska Corvette Association. The next breakfast is scheduled for October 18. There will be no breakfasts November through March to give a break to the volunteers when roads can be difficult to drive.






