### **The Nuts and Bolts of Apollo**

Forty years has dimmed our memories of a remarkable time and a fantastic journey. Apollo took 12 men to the moon with immense and majestic machines-- not seen before or since. Through a large collection of beautiful photographs, anecdotes and movies, the 'nuts and bolts' engineering aspects of the Saturn V Moon Rocket and the Apollo spacecraft are brought into a focus seen by relatively few. The technical and piloting details of flying a lunar landing are shown and out-the-window movies have you 'look over the shoulders' of Neal Armstrong and others as they have the flying experience of a lifetime. Anecdotes from the transcripts of the astronaut's debriefings tell what it really felt like on the moon in terms not generally known. And then, a few words on why we should go back.

**Directions to meeting place:** Enter Airpark from the north or south on NW 48<sup>th</sup> Street.

Turn east on West Cuming Street, go four blocks to NW 44th. The building is on the Southeast corner at 5000 NW 44<sup>th</sup>. Parking is available west of the building, with additional space across the street to the northwest.
