On a more monetary note, AIRCRAFT INSURANCE is of prime importance to all of us, and I have been trying in vain to reduce my liability and hull coverage insurance payments on my BD-4, from the back-breaking \$7.25 per day, whether it flies or not, to a more comfortable rate.

To that end, I consulted Aviation Underwriter's local office head, who has been giving away to anyone FREE OF CHARGE, one or more aircraft/small auto sun screens, displaying their logo and phone number on one side, and a fine 36x18" reproduction of the standard FLIGHT PLAN blank, with a prominent disclaimer, "REMOVE BEFORE FLIGHT," printed above it. It features a die cut flange hole for the compass, and is intended to be put over the panel of the average light plane to keep inside temps from soaring. But after passing out an armload of these freebies to friends, I see F-4 pilot Kelly Noler has one keeping his ancient Mazda coupe cooler inside, and it fits perfectly.

Kelly tells me that in Air Guard ground school, the motto of the instructors is; "AVIATE...NAVIGATE...AND THEN COMMUNICATE."

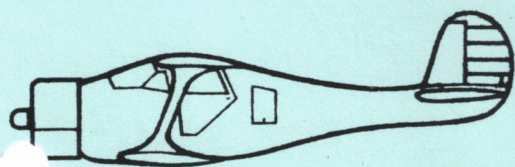
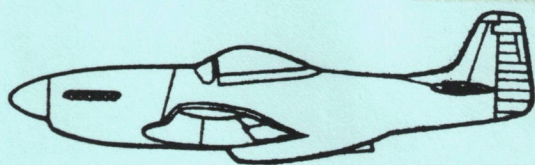

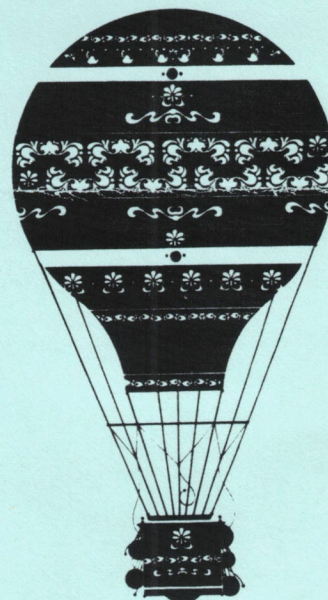
